### **WELCOME**

Welcome to Halloween Week! Every one is amped and looking forward to the disco tonight. More information is contained later in the newsletter.

### **ATTENDANCE**

Since the Covid pandemic the level of attendance across New Zealand has become increasingly concerning. Regular Attendance is described by the Ministry of Education as students attending school over 90% of the time. A new report released today by the Education Review Office (ERO), "Left Behind: How do we get our chronically absent students back to school?", reveals more than 80,000 students missed more than three weeks of school in Term 2 this year. The evidence shows that attendance is directly related to how well learners achieve. The more learners attend, the higher their achievement, and the more NCEA credits they gain. We understand that circumstances such as illness or family commitments can impact attendance. However, it is our aim as a school to support both our whānau to ensure all tamariki attending regularly. Here are a few reasons why consistent attendance is so important. For the most part, our school has decent rates of attendance and effective methods of communication when absence occurs. Just as a reminder I thought I would highlight the importance of regular attendance:

- Students who attend school regularly perform better academically. Each lesson builds on the last, and being present helps them grasp concepts more fully.
- School is a place where children learn to interact with their peers. Regular attendance fosters friendships and improves social skills, which are essential for their future.
- Establishing a routine of regular attendance helps students develop responsibility and time management skills that will benefit them throughout their lives.

I would like to acknowledge the work of our Attendance Service who operate throughout the region to support students and whānau to attend regularly. If you believe you or your child would benefit from support from this service please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

I would like to extend a huge note of appreciation to all our whānau for working with us to ensure our tamariki attend regularly and achieve the results they so richly deserve.

### AWESOME BUDDY READERS

This term we have got a group of Year 5 students participating in a buddy reading programme with Tui Early Learners Lytton Street. Each week these students visit Tui and read to the tamariki. Not only is this a great way for our Year 5s to build relationships with future school students but to build upon and promote literacy for all those involved.









## TE AO MAORI @ LSS - TE MANAWANUI

Te Manawanui ki te Reo is a Kaupapa Māori-based philosophy with a strong focus on integrating te reo Māori me ōna tikanga into an everyday english-medium learning curriculum. Teaching and learning involves a higher percentage of te reo Māori use in classrooms alongside the implementation of tikanga based practices. We have a team of developing speakers of te reo who will offer our students the opportunity to acquire, practice, and build proficiency. In Te Manawanui ki te reo Māori we have adopted the Whare Tapawhā model of well being designed by local kaumatua Sir Mason Durie. This ensures that all corners of the learner's whare are supported equally, to allow for growth and development. The strong whanau environment continues from year to year. As much as we emphasise the reo, tikanga is our foundation and

something that we uphold on a daily basis. In 2025 Te Manawanui ki te reo Māori will be offered as an option for those tamariki and their whānau who require their students to be involved in classrooms where a higher percentage of te reo Māori and tikanga is spoken and shared. It has been extremely impressive to view the language that our kids now possess through direct involvement in this programme. A letter and response form will be sent out shortly.

### **GUMBOOT FRIDAY**

Gumboot Friday is a FREE counselling service for any young person in New Zealand aged 25 and under. An under resourced public mental health service has led to long wait times for young people needing immediate help. Gumboot Friday was designed to meet the needs of young people and provides free and timely access to counselling. In order to raise awareness of this organisation our kids will be undertaking a range of activities run by our Te Raulura leadership team. These activities include Gumboot Throwing, Fill The Bucket, Rob The Nest, Three-Legged Race, Big White Boot Race and Knock The Gumboot. book a 30-minute disco session for your child on Tuesday or Wednesday. Visit our Facebook page to reserve a spot!


