Kia hiwa raa, kia hiwa raa! Earlier this week, the Hīkoi mō te Tiriti began at both ends of the country. The hīkoi is in protest against the proposed Treaty Principles Bill which had its first reading in Parliament this afternoon. Over 35,000 people marched over the Harbour Bridge in Auckland and the hīkoi has now made its way through Kirikiriroa (Hamilton). It is on its way to Hastings on Friday, and will then head to Palmerston North on Saturday.
