ROOM 12-15 BUILDING PROJECT

We are delighted to announce that the renovations of Block 2,

Rooms 12-15 will begin next week. BB Construction are completing the works. The renovation will begin with the both sets of toilets. These will be locked internally and fenced externally. In the new year Rooms 14 and 15 will be out of action for a 7 week period whilst the work is undertaken. Stacker-slider doors are being installed between the rooms as well as external ones to enable a great flow into the outdoors. The design is very similar to that already seen successfully in operation in Rooms 1-4 and 16-20. It is hoped all building work will be completed within a 6 month timeframe.

As we look towards 2025 our focus is on further developing the concept of Māramatanga. Our school has worked alongside our iwi, Ngāti Kauwhata to define it. It is our intention to hold Māramatanga as our school key value or focus.

Māramatanga means to be aware, but it carries a richer meaning. This includes an understanding or enlightenment, and deep insight. It is more than just knowledge; it implies a profound understanding that comes from experience and heightened awareness. Māramatanga reflects the idea of gaining insights that lead to a deeper understanding of yourself, others, and the world around you.

Māramatanga will be explored through three key elements - Kare ā Roto (Emotional), Whanaungatanga (Relationships) and Hinengaro (Cognitive). In the newsletters that follow, these terms will be further explored and defined.
