Waitangi Day | Rā o Waitangi

Every year on the 6th February, New Zealand marks the signing of Te Tiriti o Waitangi (Treaty of Waitangi) in 1840. In that year, representatives of the British Crown and over 500 Māori chiefs signed what is often considered to be New Zealand's founding document. The day was first officially commemorated in 1934, and it has been a public holiday since 1974.

For some people, Waitangi Day is a holiday; for others it is the occasion to reflect on Te Tiriti. Since the 1970s the style and mood of the commemorations on Waitangi Day have been influenced by the increasingly heated debate surrounding the place of Te Tiriti in modern New Zealand. As in previous years large gatherings were once again seen at Waitangi, the location of the

initial debate and signing of Te Tiriti.

This year our school is pleased to offer a high performance sports programme. This programme will operate from 7.30am-8.30am five days a week and also from 3pm-4pm three days per week. 
TAMARIKI TOA
