REPORTS AND ATTENDANCE

At the Learning Conversations coming up from the 25th-27th March you will receive a report regarding your child's progress and achievement to date. There will be a section in each newsletter for the next few weeks documenting aspects of the report and how to interpret them. Firstly, your child will have an attendance section. As you may be aware attendance is a major priority for the National government. Attendance is a major contributor to achievement. It is essential that students attend school as often as possible in order to achieve their potential. Below is an example of the format you will receive in your child's report. The terminology used is that directly provided by the Ministry of Education.

Good Fewer than 5 days absence a term

Worrying Up to 10 days absence a

Concerning Up to 15 days absence a Serious Concern 15 or more days absence a term

The shaded area shows the area of attendance that your child currently fits into. Please be aware that there are many reasons for attendance becoming concerning and if these are communicated to school then these reasons are taken into account. Thank you for your support.
