TE TIRITI O WAITANGI

Currently, the Board of Trustees, through the Treaty requirement currently in the Education Act, states schools would give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, including by ensuring plans, policies, and local curriculum reflected local tikanga Māori, mātauranga Māori, and te ao Māori; taking all reasonable steps to make instruction available in tikanga Māori and te reo Māori; and achieving equitable outcomes for Māori students. There are currently plans to remove this from legislation.

The current Education Minister, Erica Stanford said the Treaty was the Crown's responsibility, not schools'. She goes on to state, "School boards should have direction and we are giving very clear direction. You (schools) need to ensure

equitable outcomes for Māori students, you need to be offering te reo Māori and you need to be culturally competent," she said.

The Protect Te Tiriti o Waitangi in Education petition has been initiated and is being led by the National Iwi Chairs Forum with support by many of the unions and organisations involved in education. This change to legislation will be discussed by our Board of Trustees at their next meeting.

CAMP RAUKAWA

Our camp out to Raukawa, north of Whanganui was a huge success for our students. The camp, situated in

bushland and run by the YMCA offers a unique variety of experiences within a safe and supportive environment. This year we took our very own Camp Mums, Tina and Joy (normally Teacher Aides), who looked after all the food and managed the kitchen.
