WELCOME

A massive welcome to you all. With only three weeks left of this term the year is simply flying by. Last week we reported on the outstanding achievements of our students in relation to the Progressive Achievement Tests (PATs). These are national normalised assessments. Tracking student progress is one of the fundamental actions of your Board of Trustees. Having this knowledge, in its explicit form, enables us, with certainty, to ensure funding is directed towards the right places. The Board has continued to ensure our new entrant rooms have an extremely low teacher-to-student ratio. Research informs us that having low numbers in this area of the school enables our staff to identify student's learning needs and ensure they are met early in their school life - thus enabling them to achieve success in their latter years.

In addition, the school has received funding to operate both Mathematics and Literacy support programmes.

FOOTBALL WORLD CUP

The FIFA World Cup is the world's premier international soccer tournament, held every four years since 1930. It features men's national teams competing for global supremacy, with powerhouse nations like five-time champions Brazil dominating its history, and Argentina entering the current cycle as the defending champions. The 2026 tournament is currently underway, running from June 11 to July 19. In a historic milestone, the event is being jointly hosted across North America by the United States, Mexico, and Canada. This edition introduces a massive format expansion, growing from 32 to 48 teams for the first time and creating an action-packed 104-match schedule. Teams are currently battling to secure a spot in the newly introduced Round of 32 knockout phase, all aiming for the grand finale in New Jersey on July 19. The All Whites are the team to watch - games are played via a pass, purchased on TVNZ.



ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND FENCING

As mentioned in previous newsletters the Adventure Playground will be fenced during the next school holidays - July 6th onwards. This is a wonderful addition for our school and the fence will also encompass the bike shed and physical education shed. The reduced area will enable students to feel more comfortable and also offer increased opportunities for supervision and independence.
