TE A O MĀORI @ LYTTON STREET

Marae- Places of gathering and refuge.

Generally, a marae is a fenced-in complex of carved buildings and grounds that belongs to a particular iwi (tribe), hapū (subtribe) or whānau (family). Māori see their marae as their tūrangawaewae - their place to stand and belong. Marae are



used for hui (meetings), āhuareka (celebrations), tangi (funerals), educational workshops and other important tribal events. A marae often incorporates a wharenui (carved meeting house), a marae ātea (an open space in front), a wharekai (a dining hall and cooking area), and a toilet and shower block.

Feilding has two local marae connected to the Iwi of Ngāti Kauwhata: Aorangi Marae and its meeting house, Maniaihu; and Kauwhata Marae or Kai Iwi Pā which has two meeting houses named Kauwhata, and Te Aroha o ngā Mokopuna. In the late 1870s, "Te Iwa Tekau" (literally 90 feet), a large marae at Awahuri, said to have been 90 feet in length, was built in preparation for the arrival of the then Māori King, Tāwhiao. This meeting house was located on the east bank of the Oroua River, a few hundred metres south of the main highway between Palmerston North and Bulls. The house fell into disrepair during the early 20th century and was blown down in the great gale of 1936.

It was our intention to spend next week engaging with Kauwhata Marae and the people of Ngāti Kauwhata however, due to recent flooding, these visits have had to be rescheduled for later in the year.
