TE AO MĀORI @ LYTTON STREET

To celebrate Matariki our school is holding some special events. On Friday 4th August a symbolic hāngi will be laid down at 2.30am. The symbolic hangī will be lifted at 5.30am, prior to the commencement of the hautapu ceremony at 5.45am.



Before the sun rises, everyone will gather together and begin by reciting the Matariki karakia. There are 10 karakia to be recited, and each one has a specific purpose. The order is as follows:

- Waere: (a karakia to clear the area)
- Pōhutukawa: To remember those who have passed- At the completion of the karakia to Pōhutukawa and the calling of the names, uncover your umu or pot to let the steam rise into the sky as an offering to Matariki.
- Tipuānuku: Kai from Papatūānuku
- Tipuārangi: Kai from the sky
- Waitī: Kai from fresh water
- Waitā: Kai from the oceans
- Waipunarangi: The rains
- Ururangi: The winds
- Hiwa-i-te-rangi: Our hopes and aspirations

Matariki is the main star in the cluster. It is connected to wellbeing and welcomes in the New Year.

Once the Hautapu ceremony is completed, we will make our way to the hall to share breakfast provided by the school. Mānawatia a Matariki!

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
iBIKE FOR KIDS
