Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori Kapa Haka Festival and Mahuru Māori 2023

opportunity for new members to experience the excitement and joy that is performance kapa haka and we are very proud of each and every one of them. There were a multitude of smiles and the odd tear from many parents, grandparents and whānau members. A huge mihi to those whānau who gave up their time on Saturday to support this kaupapa.

In line with our maramataka Māori, this year Mahuru Māori starts on Friday 15 September 2023. It doesn't matter whether your reo skills stop at kia ora, or you can whaikorero on the marae with the best of them, Mahuru Māori is something we can all do. So jump on the waka e hoa mā, and let's give Mahuru Māori our best shot.



Mahuru Māori is a great opportunity for everyone to speak te reo Māori. It doesn't matter what your current level of Māori language may be, we encourage you to take up the challenge! You're fully in charge! Set your goals and intentions at the start of the month to a level you know is realistic for you. This could be in a number of different ways:

- greeting everyone in te reo Māori
- speaking only te reo for an hour a day
- speaking te reo for 2 hours a day every day
- half the day every day
- every day for the whole month of September.

We know for many participants it will take a conscious effort to stick to your reo Māori goals. But we hope you're encouraged that you're not alone in this challenge and together we all help to normalise the use of te reo Māori within our many communities.

Me karawhuia! Give it a go!

Over the years we've noticed a growing number of participants are beginners. To help support their commitment to Mahuru Māori we've set two new challenges specifically for them: to speak only te reo Māori for half an hour or, if you're brave enough, for half the day, each day during the challenge.
