

Māori Achievement Collaborative Huiā-Tau 2023

This week, Whāea Nicola, Whāea Paige, Whāea Jenna, Whāea Sarah & Pā Ronald attended the annual MAC conference in Auckland. The Māori Achievement Collaborative (MAC) is a non-profit organisation, a

professional learning and development pathway by principals for principals focused on changing education outcomes for Māori students. They were able to listen to esteemed keynote speakers who shared their expertise and experiences in working towards raising achievement for tamariki Māori. However, it is well known within education that what is good for Māori learners, is good for all learners. Some of the messages reaffirmed the highly successful kaupapa or programmes we currently have at LSS including

the use of Te Pae Tapū to start our learning each day, the move towards normalising te reo Māori and our focus on identifying the giftedness in each of our tamariki. While at the conference our kaiako were able to share our story, and listen to the narratives of many other schools from around the country. We look forward to hearing more about some of the learning they have gained from the conference. A huge mihi to our Board for supporting our staff to attend and continue to learn to find new and innovative ways to support our learners' achievement.
