TE MANAWANUI KI TE REO 2024

Te Manawanui ki te Reo is a Kaupapa Māori-based philosophy with a strong focus on integrating te reo Māori me ōna tikanga into an everyday english-medium learning curriculum. Teaching and learning involves a higher percentage of te reo Māori use in classrooms alongside the implementation of tikanga based practices. We have a team of developing speakers of te reo who will offer our students the opportunity to acquire, practice, and build proficiency.

In Te Manawanui ki te reo Māori we have adopted the Whare Tapawhā model of well being designed by local

kaumatua Sir Mason Durie. This ensures that all corners of the learner's whare are supported equally, to allow for growth and development.

The strong whānau environment continues from year to year. As much as we emphasise the reo, tikanga is our foundation and something that we uphold on a daily basis. A letter will come out shortly.

SPECIALIST TEACHERS

In 2024 the school has provided funding to release both Whaea Kathy, Mr Lewis and Pā Ronald from their full time teaching responsibilities. This is huge for our school and offers a massive opportunity. With this in mind we have decided to allocate specialist teaching roles to all three. Whaea Kathy will teach Robotics; Mr Lewis will teach Science; and Pā Ronald will teach Te Reo Māori. All three specialists will also teach a component of Physical Education. We believe this exciting opportunity will enable our students to gain skills and knowledge at a much deeper level. It will also provide good preparation for students as they move onto their intermediate and high school years. Each class will get at least three days of specialist teaching per term.

Each year, we begin our school celebration by welcoming all whānau and guests with a haka pōwhiri. This year, our school celebration will be held on December 6th at the Feilding Civic Centre. More details will come in the next few weeks. In te ao Māori,



this is to honour the mana of those arriving or attending. You will often see and hear of haka pōwhiri being put on for esteemed visitors, dignitaries and special guests. For this evening, you are our special guests, who have arrived to celebrate a wonderful year with us. Generally speaking, the words used in a haka pōwhiri descend from the great migration or the landing of a waka to shore with the Tangata Whenua (home people), pulling the waka ashore. There are many variations and the passage below is but a short example;

'Toia mai! i te waka!'
'Pull! The waka!'
'Ki te urunga! te waka!'
'To its place of rest! the waka!'

We look forward to sharing this very special evening, and the performance of our haka powhiri with you all.


